NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE

Date Issued: January 21, 2010

Proposed Uniform Standards: Individual Long-Term Care Insurance Standards for the Outline of Coverage

- 1. Purpose of Proposed New Rules:** The purpose of the Individual Long-Term Care Insurance Standards for the Outline of Coverage (“Proposed Standards”) is to establish standards for the long-term care insurance outline of coverage required by Section 1A(1)(b) of the proposed Core Standards for Individual Long-Term Care Insurance Policies.
- 2. Legal Authority:** The Commission is authorized to create uniform standards for products by Article IV, Section 2 of the Interstate Insurance Product Regulation Compact, as enacted into law by each compacting state.
- 3. Text of Proposed New Rules:** The Proposed Standards are available on the Commission’s web site (www.insurancecompact.org) and included with this notice as a separate document.
- 4. Where, When, and How Persons May Present Their Views:** The Management Committee for the Commission will accept written comment on the Proposed Standards until **March 22, 2010**. - 5. Where, When, and How Persons May Request a Public Hearing:** Written requests for a public hearing on the Proposed Standards must be received no later than **February 10, 2010**. Persons who may request a public hearing are Commission members, the Management Committee, the Legislative Committee, the Consumer Advisory Committee, the Industry Advisory Committee, or a person or organization representing at least 25 persons affected by the Proposed Standards.
