NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULE

Date Issued: June 6, 2008

Proposed New Rule: Operating Procedure for the Filing of Certifications for Foreign Language Translations for Product Filings

- (1) **Purpose of Proposed New Rule:** The Operating Procedure for the Filing of Certifications for Foreign Language Translations for Product Filings (the “Proposed Rule”) establishes procedures for the certifications of foreign language translations for product filings approved by the Commission to be sold or otherwise issued in languages other than English, if permitted under the laws of a compacting state.
- (2) **Legal Authority:** The IIPRC is authorized to promulgate operating procedures pursuant to Article IV, Section 6 of the Interstate Insurance Product Regulation Compact (“Compact”), as enacted into law by each Compacting State.
- (3) **Text of Proposed New Rule:** The proposed rule is available on the IIPRC’s web site (www.insurancecompact.org) and included with this notice as a separate document.
- (4) **Where, When and How Persons May Present Their Views:** The Management Committee of the IIPRC will accept written comments on this proposed new rule until **August 5, 2008**. - (5) **Where, When and How Persons May Request a Public Hearing:** Written requests for a public hearing must be received no later than **June 26, 2008**. Persons who may request a public hearing are Commission members, the Management Committee, the Legislative Committee, the Consumer Advisory Committee, the Industry Advisory Committee, or a person or organization representing at least 25 persons affected by the proposed rule.
